**GEORGE WASHINGTON  
PEACE CERTIFICATE**

This document accompanied President George Washington's speech to the Indian Nations delivered in Philadelphia on Nov. 29, 1796.

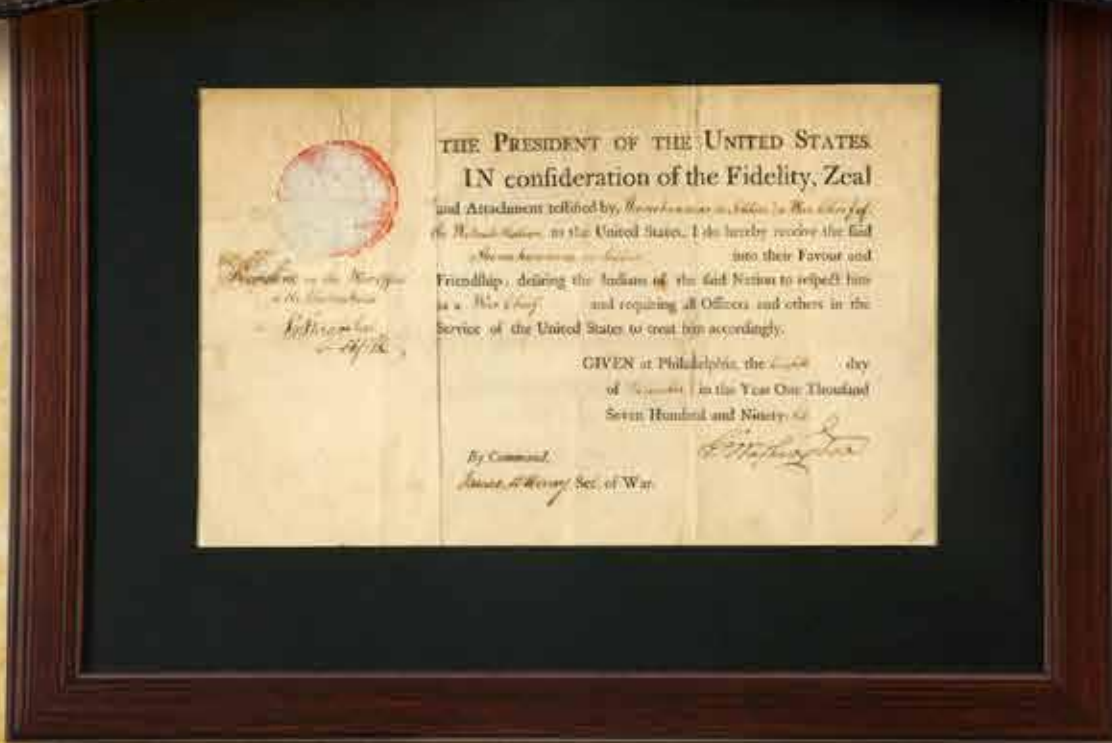
An earlier delegation in 1793 included Chief Little Turtle, who was a signer of the August 1795 Treaty of Greenville. As Washington's speech to the chiefs indicated, this was part of the effort to build on that treaty to maintain peace with the Western Indians.

The Cass County Historical Society is housed in the Jerolaman-Long Home, built in 1853. Twenty rooms showcase thousands of artifacts from Cass County's past, including paintings by noted local artists — among them, George Winter and Wils Berry — personal belongs of Gen. John Tipton, military uniforms and equipment dating back to the early 1800s, Native America artifacts, and much more.

The museum is open Tuesday through Saturday from 1 p.m to 5 p.m., closed Sundays, Mondays, and holidays, and by appointment only in January.
